The British Chinese Language Teaching Society (BCLTS) and Confucius Institute for Scotland at the University of Edinburgh are pleased to announce the 20th International Conference of BCLTS, *Teaching Chinese as a Foreign Language in the New Normal: Cross-Disciplinary Theory and Practice.* This will take place at the University of Edinburgh on the 29<sup>th</sup> of June – 1st July 2023.

The BCLTS is a UK registered charity for Chinese language teachers and researchers from UK universities and beyond. The University of Edinburgh is a public research university located in Edinburgh, Scotland. Founded in 1582, it is one of the four oldest universities in Scotland. Edinburgh is a member of several associations of research universities, including the Coimbra Group, League of European Research Universities, and Russell Group, etc. As of January 2023, the University of Edinburgh has 19 Nobel Prize winners, four Pulitzer Prize winners, three Turing Award winners, and an Abel Prize laureate and Fields Medallist. The University was ranked 15th in the 2023 QS World University Rankings. The Confucius Institute for Scotland at the University is a cultural institution established in 2006 by the Chinese-Foreign Language Exchange and Cooperation Centre. The Confucius Institute for Scotland has been providing a wide range of Chinese training courses to promote cooperation between Scotland and China in the fields of language, education, culture and economy, and to help develop Sino-Scotland economic, trade, cultural and academic ties.

We invite submission of abstracts for conference oral presentation (25 minutes), workshops and/or panel discussions (60-minutes) and posters (see examples here). Every abstract submitted will be peer reviewed and a selection of papers will be published in the Conference Proceeding. The working languages for this conference are English and Chinese.
